GETTING READY FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

The first day at secondary school can be quite daunting and it is important that your child is fully prepared and equipped to ensure the day goes as smoothly as possible. Use the handy checklist on this page to help make sure that your child is organised and ready for what the day has in store!

BREAKFAST

We all know that breakfast is the most important meal of the day. Even if your child feels nervous, try to encourage them to eat something, as it's a long time until lunch! In addition, we run a bagel breakfast club from 8.25 to 8.40 every day and breakfast is free to everyone. It takes place in the canteen.



BACKPACK/BAG

A sensible bag is vitally important for school. It should be very strong and durable (and waterproof if possible). There will be lots of things for your son or daughter to carry and you should check that your chosen bag has enough room for several books.

LUNCH/CASHLESS SYSTEM

If your son or daughter will be eating in the school canteen, please ensure that they have enough funds on their ParentPay account.

If a packed lunch is being provided from home, remember to check that your child takes it to school. ParentPay log in details will be emailed to families over the Summer Holidays.

Setting THE STANDARD

THE 'POSITIVE DISCIPLINE' BEHAVIOUR POLICY

Our School believes in the development of each individual and is committed to providing the best opportunities for all in an atmosphere of mutual respect.

We seek to provide an environment in which effective teaching and learning can occur, where the qualities of trust, honesty, fairness, tolerance, compassion, respect for self, others and property are valued and pursued.

The school's behaviour policy seeks to provide a clear framework of what is acceptable in terms of behaviour, attitude to learning, and conduct.

Students are introduced to our behaviour policy upon transition to Graham School.

Regular discussions then take place during form times that maintain their understanding of the policy, and review their positive and negative behaviour choices with their tutor and head of Year.

This is the Graham School Student Code of Conduct – **T.R.U.S.T.**

Try your best
Respect others, always;
Uniform matters: wear it correctly and with pride.
Stay safe: behave calmly and sensibly at all times.
Time is important: be in the right place at the right time!

Phases

A phase will be issued by staff when a student fails to meet one of the school expectations. These codes are listed below:

THE PROCESS

The flow diagram on the right shows the stages involved in the sanctioning of unacceptable behaviour in lessons.

Three comments in a lesson will result in the student being removed to another teacher. This will automatically result in an after school detention which will last for 25 minutes.

If a student fails to attend a 25 minute detention they will be referred to a second detention at the next available opportunity. Failure to attend this detention will result in the student completing a day in seclusion.

All detentions will be made clear to students via a student notice board.

Times of detentions will be sent to parents via our edulink app.


REWARDS

Student achievement is celebrated through 'celebration assemblies' every term. The celebration assemblies look to reward students for their effort, achievement, positive attitude and their attendance throughout the course of the term. During this assembly, the students with the most stamps in each year group may be rewarded with vouchers as a 'well done' for their hard work that term.

All students can work towards stamps in every lesson and around school, so every pupil has the opportunity to achieve these rewards and as such, develop their own sense of achievement and an understanding that through working hard and doing their best, good things can happen!

The number of stamps is reset at the end of each term, so if a student hasn't been successful during any particular term, they have every opportunity to do so during the next one.

Rewards are also issued for academic excellence, most improved, high attendance and for those 'Unsung heroes' whose performance is always high, but who can sometimes go under the radar.



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GETTING TO school

Students are representing the school on their journey to and from school, and therefore we expect them to:

- Show members of the public respect and represent the school in the correct manner.
- Wear their uniform appropriately.
- Behave in a sensible and responsible manner.
- Be on time to school in the morning.
- Dismount their bikes and walk them through the school gates.

As students are representatives of the school on their way too and from school, any misdemeanours reported to school from the public will be treated as if the child were in school.

To make cycling to and from school a positive experience for everybody concerned, we expect our students to:

- Ride sensibly and safely and to follow the Highway Code.
- Check that their bicycle is roadworthy and regularly maintained
- Behave in a manner which shows them and the school in the best possible light and to consider the needs of others when cycling.
- Wear a cycle helmet.
- Ensure they can be seen by other road users, by using lights and wearing high-visibility clothing, as appropriate.

PUNCTUALITY

- Students are expected to be in school and in their form room by 8.45am
- Latecomers will receive a phase. After five phases, each time a student is late thereafter, a detention will be issued.
- Pupils late to school after 09:15 will receive an immediate detention.
- All students should enter school through their respective student entrance.
- Year 7 enter through the main visitors gate.
- Students will leave school through their student entrance at 3.15pm.



HIGH EXPECTATIONS Appearance

At Graham School we have high expectations around the appearance of our students. All students are expected to wear our school uniform correctly. Hair must be of a natural colour and not be of an extreme style. Jewellery must not be worn, although a single plain stud in each ear is allowed. This means that all rings, necklaces and additional ear-rings will need to be removed; this list is not exhaustive.

False nails are not allowed, although short french nails are acceptable. There are no further exceptions to this due to health and safety issues concerns that false nails present.

False eyelashes are not allowed.

Students will be expected to rectify breaches of the above expectations, and sanctions may be put in place if they are unwilling to do this.



HOW TO MAKE

Payments

As a school we have embraced ParentPay, a secure online cashless system, so students will not be required to bring cash to school at all. This decision has been made to avoid students losing money between home and school, reduce the risk of bullying and put all students on a level platform.

WAYS TO PAY

ParentPay is an online payment system for schools. It allows parents to pay quickly and securely for school meals, trips and activities, uniforms, music lessons and fees

You simply top-up your ParentPay account online by debit or credit card. Payment by standing order and faster payments will be available soon.

Your ParentPay balance can be used immediately to pay for any of your children's items at any school using ParentPau.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS TO PARENTS AND PUPILS?

ParentPay is easy to use and will offer you the freedom to make online payments whenever and wherever you like – 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.

 The technology used is of the highest internet security available ensuring that your money will reach school safely – offering you peace of mind.

- Payments can be made by credit/debit card.
- Full payment histories and statements are available securely online at any time.
- Your children won't have to worry about losing money at school
- Parents can choose to be alerted when their balances are low via email and/or SMS text.
- It is safer for students.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T HAVE ACCESS TO THE INTERNET?

You can add money to the parentpay account using paypoints which are available in many local shops. Details will be at the bottom of the ParentPay letter that you will receive during the summer holidays.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS TO OUR SCHOOL?

You can help us reduce workloads for all staff, creating more time to lend to educational support and the smooth running of the school. Using ParentPay ensures that all financial transactions are safe and secure – helping us to remove costs associated with us having to manage cash securely on the school premises.







How to get started with ParentPay...

We will send you your account activation username and password during the summer holidays.

Once you receive these:

- Visit www.parentpay.com
- Enter your activation username and password in the Account Login section of the homepage.

NB: These are for one-time use only, you will choose your own username and password for future access during the activation process.

 Provide all the necessary information and choose your new username and password for your account – registering your email address will enable us to send you receipts and reminders.

Once activation is complete you can go straight to Items for payment, select which item(s) you want to add to your basket and proceed to complete your payment.

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GIVE YOUR EDUCATION

an extra boost!

At Graham School we are proud to be able to offer a whole range of extra-curricular opportunities, both in and out of school time. These range from a large choice of afterschool clubs to fantastic trips to other countries and even continents! Below are just some of the different opportunities on offer:

DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

Here at Graham School, the Duke of Edinburgh Award is offered to students at all levels. Over the past few years, many students have thrived whilst completing the award and developed a host of individual and social skills in a countryside setting. This is a must for anyone who loves being outdoors! Look out for this opportunity in Year 9 onwards!

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The PE department will be running afterschool clubs which will cover a host of different sports including football, netball, gymnastics, rugby, athletics and rounders, depending on the time of year. We enter teams for boys and girls across all year groups into competitions, giving students the chance to represent their school in local, district and national competitions.





DRAMA

The school has put on some wonderful productions over the years, as well as a host of smaller shows throughout the year. All budding actors and actresses should get involved in everything drama!

MUSIC

Whether you play an instrument, are a singer or just want to get involved, everyone is always welcome at the music clubs. As with drama, the clubs are a chance to practise before performing in the bigger productions that everyone looks forward to!

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

The voice of our students is taken seriously here at Graham School and as such, we have a strong Student Leadership Team. These meetings take place regularly which feed into a Whole School Focus and cover a wide range of issues, both in and out of school.

TRIP

There are lots of chances to go on a range of trips at Graham School. We offer visits abroad, numerous university trips, careers orientated workshops, sessions linked to wider curriculum areas, STEM activities, short residentials to include outdoor pursuits.

This is just a taste of some of the things you will be able to enjoy in the coming years at Graham School.

FREQUENTLY ASKED questions?

WHERE SHOULD MY CHILD GO ON THE FIRST DAY?

On the first transition day and the first day in September, all students should go straight to the main hall at which point they will be escorted to their new form groups. Staff will be at the entrance to guide students in the right direction.

WHAT EQUIPMENT WILL MY CHILD NEED?

To make learning as accessible as possible all students should be equipped with a strong suitable school bag (not handbag style), black or blue ink pen, a green pen, a purple pen, pencils and rubber, ruler and a calculator.

If a scientific calculator can be purchased this would be more appropriate. All of the above can be purchased from any high street stationery shop.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD GETS LOST BETWEEN LESSONS?

We fully appreciate that moving around a large unfamiliar site has its difficulties. There will be staff and students available during lesson changeovers to help direct students who feel that they are lost. All Year 7 students will have a site map to help with movement. It takes about two weeks for everyone to find their way around confidently. Staff will be very understanding during this period if a Year 7 arrives late to a lesson.

DOES GRAHAM SCHOOL PROVIDE LOCKERS?

Unfortunately, we simply do not have any space to provide lockers for all students throughout the school. There are a very limited number of lockers that we use and these are prioritised for some of our more vulnerable students.



MY CHILD IS VERY NERVOUS ABOUT THE MOVE TO SECONDARY SCHOOL. CAN I VISIT WITH THEM BEFORE TRANSITION DAY?

We do have enhanced transition for vulnerable students that are arranged through our Learning Support Team and the Primary Schools. If your child requires a visit to settle any nerves or anxieties we would be very happy to support you in this.

WHO SHOULD MY CHILD SEE IF THEY HAVE AN ISSUE?

We make every effort to ensure that any issues are dealt with promptly. Every student has a form tutor, a behaviour support officer and a Head of Year.

The form tutor should be consulted in the first instance however if they are unavailable at the time then the student should visit the year office and speak with the behaviour support officer. Dependent on the issue raised, the Head of Year may become involved to support the student and contact will be made home if felt appropriate.

CAN MY CHILD BRING THEIR MOBILE PHONE TO SCHOOL?

The majority of our students own a mobile phone and we are aware that students bring them to school.

Mobiles are not to be used within the school grounds and will be confiscated on sight, locked in an office and returned at the end of the day. The continued misuse of mobile phones is dealt with very seriously.

WILL MY CHILD GET BULLIED AT SECONDARY SCHOOL?

Every effort is made to ensure that every child attending Graham School has a positive experience. The school has adopted a range of strategies to prevent and reduce bullying, to raise awareness of bullying and support victims and those displaying bullying behaviour. Where isolated incidents of bullying occur they are dealt with swiftly and in line with the Graham School anti-bullying policy which can be found on the school website.

MY CHILD PREFERS TO STAY INSIDE DURING BREAKS AND LUNCH. IS THERE ANYWHERE THAT THEY CAN GO?

Our canteen areas are open to students at break and lunch. Learning Support is also open for students during the break and lunch sessions, as is the library.

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD IS ILL AND CANNOT ATTEND SCHOOL?

We have an attendance team which can be contacted on 01723 366451. Please contact the school before

8.40am. It is important that you contact the school on each day of your child's absence, if we do not receive a phone call the attendance team will contact you to make sure your child is safe.

Medical appointments must be made outside school hours where possible and to allow the absence to be authorised a medical appointment card will be needed.

WHAT SUBJECTS WILL MY CHILD STUDY IN YEAR 7 AND HOW OFTEN WILL THEY STUDY THEM?

Year 7 have a broad curriculum on offer which consists of the subjects listed below. Students will study the subjects each week.

- English
- Maths
- Science
- Computing
- Geography
- History
- Philosophy and Ethics including Religious Studies and PSHCE
- Expressive arts (dance & drama)
- Music
- PE
- French
- Art
- Technology
- · Food/Textiles.

In addition, students also have a 25-minute form tutor session at the start of each day.

ARE ALL STUDENTS PLACED IN ABILITY GROUPS FOR LESSONS IN YEAR 7?

Most subject areas are taught in mixed ability groups. Setting can occur in subject areas during other year groups if deemed appropriate. Please refer to previous published table which outlines the setting and mixed ability element for each year 7 subject.

MY CHILD HAS A LEARNING NEED. DO I NEED TO CONTACT SCHOOL TO HIGHLIGHT THIS?

The information transferred from primary school is very detailed and if your child received support in primary school then they will receive support in secondary school.

Our Learning Support Team will contact parents of students in their care to carry out reviews and to gain additional information that will allow us to enhance and individualise the support that your child requires to improve their learning.

WHO DO I NEED TO SPEAK WITH TO PASS ON ANY MEDICAL CONCERNS ABOUT MY SON OR DAUGHTER?

We have a medical officer in school who can be contacted on 01723 366451. We would always encourage any medical notifications to be put in writing in addition to a conversation. Medical forms are completed prior to your child starting Graham School, however we must be made aware of any changes throughout the year. We follow NYCC guidance with regards to holding and administering any medication on site.

MY CHILD IS WORRIED ABOUT DETENTIONS AND OTHER SANCTIONS THAT THEY COULD RECEIVE AT SECONDARY SCHOOL

Graham School has high expectations of all students. We aim to create an environment that is conducive to learning and without disruption, ensuring high achievement for all.

Our expectations are made clear to all students through assemblies, form time and in lessons. Year 7 students will receive information on our sanctions and rewards during their first two days at Graham School through an assembly and during a form time discussion.

DOES THE SCHOOL PROVIDE ANY OPPORTUNITIES FOR AFTERSCHOOL CLUBS?

As a school we regularly review our afterschool clubs offer.

A list of afterschool enrichment activities for September is produced, displayed around school and emailed to families. It may be updated throughout the year. We would encourage all students to partake in at least one club.

TRANSPORT AND COLLECTION - WILL THE BUSES DROP OFF MY CHILD DIRECTLY AT SCHOOL?

Buses will drop off and pick up on the main site adjacent to the student entrances. Buses will aim to leave by 3.25pm each day.

Timetables and prices for the various bus routes can be found in your pack. Graham School has no control over pick up or drop off locations nor does it have any control over fares.


CAN I COLLECT MY CHILD BY CAR AT THE END OF THE SCHOOL DAY?

Yes, of course you can. The school day finishes at 3.15pm so collection can be made after that time.

Please note that space is very limited on the school site due to staff parking and the allocation of bus bays.

Parents are not permitted to drive onto the school site at the end of the day to collect students unless there is exceptional circumstances of which are previously agreed with school.





Children can however be dropped off by car on the school site in the morning in the designated zone.

CAN MY CHILD CYCLE TO SCHOOL?

Yes, although the safety of our students is paramount. With this in mind, we do request that all cyclists wear an appropriate helmet and that they dismount from their bikes on entering the school site. No bike should be ridden whilst on the school site for any reason. We do provide a covered cycle shed for the use of all students. Bikes should be left secured whilst on site.

We would advise that new Year 7 students carry out a few trial runs of their journey during the summer holidays to ensure that they are familiar with the surroundings.
